

4 AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS/

These sessions can be adapted to suit KS2 and KS3. They can be run as a one off event or a series of events over a half-term.

> **Hands on History** is an opportunity to look at and handle objects from the collections which are not normally on display.

> **Be a History Detective.** This session gives children the opportunity to think like an archaeologist, to ask questions and to handle artefacts. It will help to develop the concepts of chronology, change, continuity and progress while extending children's field of knowledge and vocabulary. A great way to discover how people lived in the past and how this influences us today.

> **Drama workshops.** These sessions use genuine artefacts, mostly Roman, to stimulate a variety of mime based interactive techniques to enable students to get into character and create their own stories. Objects from other time periods are also available.



BOOKING & COSTS/

Visits

- Visits to schools are charged at £40 per half day (plus travel costs for over 20 miles)
- Group size: 15 - 30 pupils, teacher/pupil ratio 2 members per 30 pupils
- Age range: KS2 - KS3.

Hire a handling box

Charges are £10 for 2 weeks. This may be extended for 1 month if not required elsewhere. Please note a £25 refundable deposit per box is required.

1 THE ROMANS ROMAN LEGACY VISIT/

> Bring history to life in the classroom by booking our educators for a half-day session.

Led by educators in Roman costume, this enquiry based session will enhance your study of the Roman period. This popular session explores the life of Lucius, a soldier at Derwentio and life in Romano-Britain. Using genuine and replica artefacts the children will get "hands on" with the past and solve practical problems while working in small groups



THE ROMANS DISCOVERY BOX & COSTUME CHEST/

> Create your own museum in your classroom with our Discovery Box, containing a range of real artefacts as well as replica items for handling. Activities include: finds sorting and exploring what the Romans did for us.

The chest contains male and female costumes and a military kit for an auxiliary foot soldier, in authentic materials. These are designed to give children an idea of life in Roman Britain.
