

Archaeology Challenge

Archaeology Challenge

Lucius has made a list of some of the most common items found on an archaeological site Can you find them all in the scenes on the other page? There is also a spot the difference puzzle to solve



Bucket

Useful for collecting up natural earth and stones etc which archaeologists call discard.



Trowel

One of the most used tools on a dig site, which is used for removing small amounts of earth.



Pot Sherd

These are pieces of broken pottery and are a common find – there are lots of types from many different centuries



Metre Stick

These are used to accurately mark out and show the size of large features or objects



Measuring Tape

These are used to take long measurments of large features like walls



Ecofacts

These are objects that come from plants and animals, and include shells, bones, and seeds



Knapped Flint

These are often thousands of years old and were used like knives to cut and scrape



Wheelbarrow

This is useful for taking away a large amount of earth, which is usually added to a mound



Soft Brush

A good tool for cleaning up loose earth to uncover details on objects and in features



Shovel and Mattock

These are used to loosen and remove large amounts of earth and stones



Metalwork

There are lots of types of metal objects mostly made from Iron, Copper, Lead – Silver and Gold are rarer



Sieve

This is useful for finding small objects which are sometimes hidden amongst discarded earth
